




Advent Book Study With Pastor Sean

Pastor Sean will begin our Advent Book Study on Sunday, December 1st at 6:30pm in the Library. We will be using the book "Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent," by Amy-Jill Levine. She explores the biblical texts surrounding the story of the birth of Jesus. Join her as she traces the Christmas narrative through the stories of Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary, the journey to Bethlehem, and the visit from the Magi. These

stories open conversations around connections of the Gospel stories to the Old Testament, the role of women in first-century Jewish culture, the importance of Mary's visitation and the revolutionary implications of Mary's Magnificat, the census and the stable, and the star of Bethlehem and the flight to Egypt.

The book provides a rich and challenging learning experience for this small group. Books will be available from the church office beginning November 18th so you have time to read the first chapter before December 1st.

Special Sunday Offerings


