This week's Sermon is based on Mark 1:21-28. Sermon Title: Good Enough: Can I Get a Witness?

Who is this man with an unclean spirit that shows up in the synagogue during this week's scripture? To us, he's loud, he interrupts and he draws attention to himself. Ironically, he does not have that effect on the people in the synagogue. Their attention is on Jesus. They are astounded by his presence and teaching. It's like nothing they have ever heard before. He has authority. His words mean something and they make a difference. Even the man with an unclean spirit is shocked and intrigued by Jesus. "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us?"

Jesus' authority fills not just the place but each person there. And almost immediately this man with an unclean spirit shows up. The presence of Jesus, the man with a clean spirit, draws out the presence of the man with an unclean spirit. Jesus has that effect on people. His authority and teaching reveal the truth about his listeners' lives. This one with the unclean spirit is an image of what the lives of those in the synagogue look like. His uncleanness is not about personal hygiene, immorality, being bad, or Judaism. Instead his presence "in their synagogue" describes the disease of their soul, their fragmented lives, and the many voices within them. In looking at him they see themselves and they are astounded by the contrast of the one who has a clean spirit. "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth?" He senses the distance between his life and Jesus'. His words betray his isolation. It's not, however, just about him. He speaks not only for himself but for all those in the synagogue that day. He represents every one who has ever experienced the brokenness of life. He is the spokesperson for all who feel disconnected from themselves, others, or God. He represents the human condition. Behind his question is the unspoken longing and hope that Jesus would say, "Everything. I have everything to do with you." Those are the words that can begin to put his life back together. We're not so different. Each one of us also longs for that answer because we too know the separation and brokenness of our own lives. We've lived in isolation. We have been trapped in grief. We have carried the burden of guilt. The truth of those situations often reveals itself in the many personas we wear.


The true voice and the true image are always present. That's why this man with an unclean spirit can cry out, "I know who you are, the Holy One of God." He speaks from a deep place of knowing. His recognition of Jesus is at a profound level a recognition of himself and his own holiness. For every voice that denies that and leaves us crying, "What have you do to with us?" Jesus says, "Shhh. Be quiet. That's not who you are. You are mine and I have everything to do with you." Listen to that voice and you too will be astounded at what can become of your life.

What Is A Bridge Church?

Bridge Churches are United Methodist faith communities which are confident they will remain United Methodist. Bridge Churches will provide pastoral support, nurture, and opportunities for connection during this time of grief and transition, always in response to each individual's needs, timing, and sense of God's call. These congregations bring no expectation of church membership; rather they offer support based on the needs of each person and community. Such support may

- * Individual pastoral care by laity and clergy from the **Bridge Church**;
- * physical space for groups to gather as they consider what faithful next step God is calling them to take;
- * providing information on ministry opportunities in which to engage or not (there will be no pressure) - these opportunities may include: worship, the invitation to grow in discipleship, small group gatherings, Bible studies, and prayer opportunities as well as participate in mission opportunities to serve through hands-on ministries;
- * assistance in finding and connecting with other individuals and groups displaced by disaffiliating churches, both for grief support and for discipleship and discernment about faithful next steps;
- * help connecting with Conference and District resources to help them discern their next steps as they consider a new church home.

Lenten Offering 2024

This year, our Lenten offering will go to benefit 3 of our in-house ministry programs. - Meals on Monday "MoM", Dinner Church "DC" and our Family Ministries program. MoM is currently preparing and serving approximately 120 lunch meals every Monday to families in our community. DC, which is our Community Family Dinner, serves a hot, home cooked meal for dinner every Wednesday, along with an encouraging message and musical entertainment as we fellowship with the friends of our community. Many of our guests have become regular church visitors to Sunday worship as well as Wednesday night worship. Our Family Ministries has now encompassed our children's fellowship, youth and family ministries into one - Family Ministries. Every month in 2024, the children and youth will host an intergenerational event for all of our church members to participate in. This began last year with the Turkey Escape Room & Pie as well as the Christmas Gingerbread House & Donuts event. Recently they hosted a Mardi Gras Pancake Dinner event. All funds raised for Family Ministry will help them to host an amazing Easter Egg Hunt, Vacation Bible School week in June, youth mission trips, and much more.

All Lenten special offerings will be divided equally between the 3 ministry programs or you are welcome to choose just one to support (please mark your offering envelope with the chosen ministry if you wish to do that.)

We thank you in advance for your generosity to all of the mission and ministry programs.



PORT (People Offering Resources Together) Shelter

Annually we host the PORT homeless shelter program once a year for one week. This March, we host the program from March 6th to the morning of March 13th.

This local homeless shelter program is organized by LINK and splits the weeks from November through the end of March between local churches who host the program for one week at a time. Other churches who are not able to host the program step in to help provide meals and volunteers during 5 of the 7 nights. This year we are hosting 2 of the nights (this means we prepare and serve the dinner and breakfast. We host on Sunday, the 10th and Tuesday, the 12th.)

Volunteers are needed for the following:

* Facility set-up before guests arrive (This may be Tuesday or Wednesday morning - time to be determined)

* Opening check-in on Sunday, March 10th & Tuesday, March 12th from 6pm to 9pm (the youth will be helping on March 10th, but a few additional adults are welcome)

* Dinner Kitchen Help on Sunday, March 10th & Tuesday, March 12th (we have a chef cook but any additional help, especially on Tuesday, is much appreciated)

* Facility Manager coordinator for overnight (10pm to 7am) for every night (the 6th to the morning of the 13th)

* Assistance with check-out on Monday morning the 11th and Wednesday morning the 13th 4:30am to 6:30am

* Breakfast Kitchen Help Monday morning, the 11th and Wednesday morning, the 13th from 4:30am to 7am

* Tagging of belongs and running to store room on Sunday the 10th & Tuesday the 12th (the youth are helping on the 10th so mainly the 12th)

For more information, please call the church office at 757-877-2270 and leave your name and number so our facility manager, Rodney Wise, can contact you (his extension is 123 or his direct line is 757-243-2182) and he'll get back to you to let you know where YOU can help. Sign-up sheets will be in the Sunday School classes.

On average, we house between 60 and 80 homeless men, women and children. We open the doors at 6:30pm and serve breakfast at 6am before they leave the property each morning (Thursday to Wednesday) for the day.

We will welcome donations of new or gently used clothes as well as new packs of men's and ladies underwear in all sizes. Feel free to drop off any donations to the church office before March 4th.

It is truly a blessing for our church to be able to participate in this program, but we do need lots of volunteer assistance. We pray that you can help.

WMUMC Endowment Grant Program

Active members of Warwick Memorial are eligible for an Endowment Grant for church related training, outreach activities, or ministry activities. All requests must support the mission and vision of WMIMC. The scholarships mentioned below generally are not meant to completely pay for training or a mission trip, but rather to fill in the gap between the funds the person can personally come up with and what the total training/trip will cost them.

Church Related Training - The purpose of this element is to provide scholarship assistance for attending church related training, or to study for the ministry.

Outreach Element – The purpose of this element is to provide funding to organize, develop, strengthen, or participate in **future** outreach activities. An outreach activity is one that results in someone getting helped **directly** in some way, such as physically or spiritually, within a reasonable amount of time. Although existing outreach activities will be eligible for these funds, priority will be given to "innovative" activities that introduce new or changed methods or areas of church outreach, program or study. Therefore, requests should be for outreach activities that are not normally funded through the annual operating budget of the church. Scholarship assistance to participate in outreach activities is also available under the conditions described in the opening paragraph.

Ministry Element - The purpose of this element is to provide funding to strengthen or expand existing ministries or to initiate new ministries. Ministries include, but are not limited to, preaching, teaching, music, health, activities for children, youth or adults, education, worship, etc. Requests for new ministry funding should be for ministry activities that are not normally funded through the annual operating budget of the church.
