## This week's Sermon is based on John 12:1-8 Sermon Title - Good Enough: We Are Fragile

Scripture is clear: We are to help the poor, feed the hungry, and care for widows, orphans, and aliens among us. At the same time, we may have questions about our decisions. How should we give? What do we give specifically and graciously to help the poor among us? What do we give to support other facets of the Lord's work generously and extravagantly?

Each is important. Each can honor God. So let's not be critical of those who give extravagantly to any of God's work. God knows the hearts of the givers, and we need to rejoice in their generosity to honor him. Even more, we all need to be generous with the Lord and those in need! After all, Jesus himself reminds us that how we use our blessings is important and that we are actually caring for him when we care for those less fortunate!

Reckless devotion to Jesus is never a bad thing. Our emotions should show when our hearts are in tune with Jesus. We may not pour out perfume in His honor, but we will want to express our love for Him through song, words, raised hands, dance, etc.

True worship will cost us something. Worship is not about mere words, although words are important. It is not just about turning up on Sunday. When we worship from the heart, our attitudes and priorities will change. It is no longer about what we want to do, but about surrendering to God's will. Our money and time become surrendered to God, and we find ourselves blessed with a generous spirit that wants to give to others and to God's work.

DC, which is our Community Family Dinner, serves a hot, home cooked meal for dinner every Wednesday, along with an encouraging message and musical entertainment as we fellowship with the friends of our community. Many of our guests have become regular church visitors to Sunday worship as well as Wednesday night worship. Our Family Ministries has now encompassed our children's fellowship, youth and family ministries into one - Family Ministries. Every month in 2024, the children and youth will host an intergenerational event for all of our church members to participate in. This began last year with the Turkey Escape Room & Pie as well as the Christmas Gingerbread House & Donuts event. Recently they hosted a Mardi Gras Pancake Dinner event. All funds raised for Family Ministry will help them to host an amazing Easter Egg Hunt, Vacation Bible School week in June, youth mission trips, and much more.

## What Is A Bridge Church?

Bridge Churches are United Methodist faith communities which are confident they will remain United Methodist. Bridge Churches will provide pastoral support, nurture, and opportunities for connection during this time of grief and transition, always in response to each individual's needs, timing, and sense of God's call. These congregations bring no expectation of church membership; rather they offer support based on the needs of each person and community. Such support may include:

- \* Individual pastoral care by laity and clergy from the **Bridge Church**;
- \* physical space for groups to gather as they consider what faithful next step God is calling them to take;
- \* providing information on ministry opportunities in which to engage or not (there will be no pressure) these opportunities may include: worship, the invitation to grow in discipleship, small group gatherings, Bible studies, and prayer opportunities as well as participate in mission opportunities to serve through hands-on ministries;
- \* assistance in finding and connecting with other individuals and groups

displaced by disaffiliating churches, both for grief support and for discipleship and discernment about faithful next steps;

\* help connecting with Conference and District resources to help them discern their next steps as they consider a new church home.

#### **Endowment Fund Information Notebook**

#### **WMUMC Endowment Grant Program**

Active members of Warwick Memorial are eligible for an Endowment Grant for church related training, outreach activities, or ministry activities. All requests must support the mission and vision of WMIMC. The scholarships mentioned below generally are not meant to completely pay for training or a mission trip, but rather to fill in the gap between the funds the person can personally come up with and what the total training/trip will cost them.

**Church Related Training -** The purpose of this element is to provide scholarship assistance for attending church related training, or to study for the ministry.

Outreach Element – The purpose of this element is to provide funding to organize, develop, strengthen, or participate in **future** outreach activities. An outreach activity is one that results in someone getting helped **directly** in some way, such as physically or spiritually, within a reasonable amount of time. Although existing outreach activities will be eligible for these funds, priority will be given to "innovative" activities that introduce new or changed methods or areas of church outreach, program or study. Therefore, requests should be for outreach activities that are not normally funded through the annual operating budget of the church. Scholarship assistance to participate in outreach activities is also available under the conditions described in the opening paragraph.

Ministry Element - The purpose of this element is to provide funding to strengthen or expand existing ministries or to initiate new ministries. Ministries include, but are not limited to, preaching, teaching, music, health, activities for children, youth or adults, education, worship, etc. Requests for new ministry funding should be for ministry activities that are not normally funded through the annual operating budget of the church.
